Fabric	Exact amount	Suggested Yardage
A	9"	3/8 yd
B	9"	3/8 yd
C	18"	5/8 yd
Backing	21" square	
Batting	20" square	
Binding	3/8 yd	

Wedge tool preparation

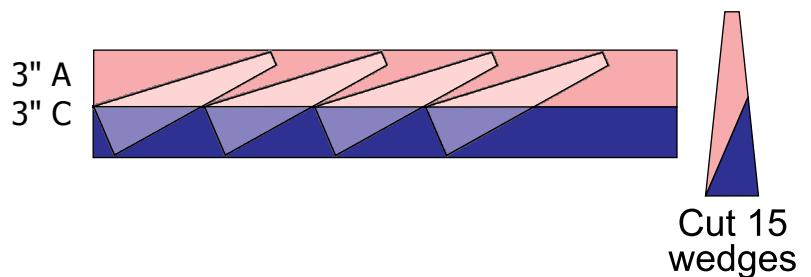
- Mark the angled line on the 12 degree wedge tool. (See following page for the diagram.)
- An accurate wedge cut is important. To keep the wedge from slipping, place a tube of wide packaging tape onto the back of the wedge tool sticky side out.

Cutting Chart

Fabric	Strips	Strip size
A	3	each 3" x width
B	3	each 3" x width
C	6	each 3" x width

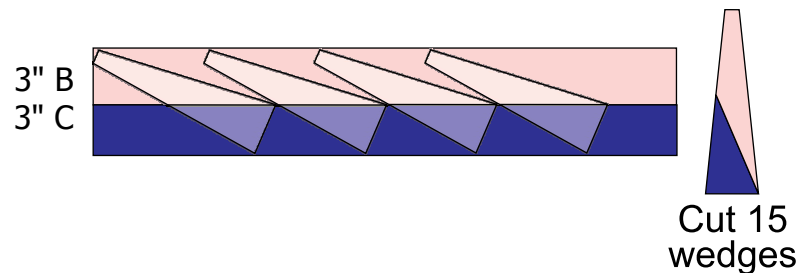
A/C wedges

- Sew three strip sets of A/C fabric.
- Cut five wedges from each A/C strip set, for a total of 15 wedges.
- Remove the tape from the wedge and place it on the other side to reverse the angle of the line.
- Cut five reverse wedges from each B/C strip set.

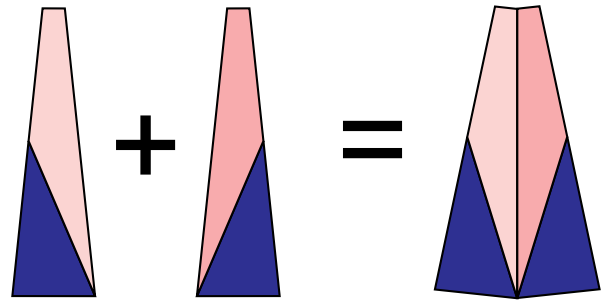


B/C wedges

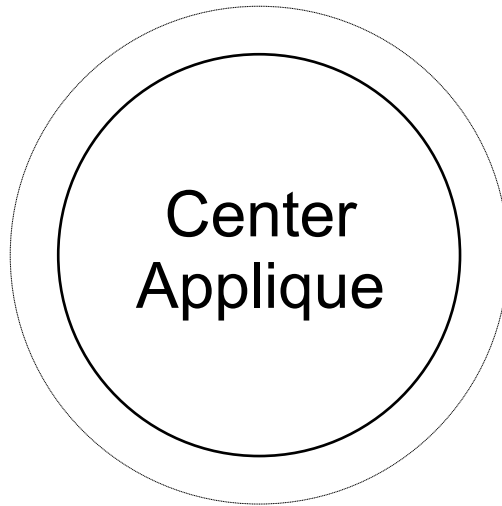
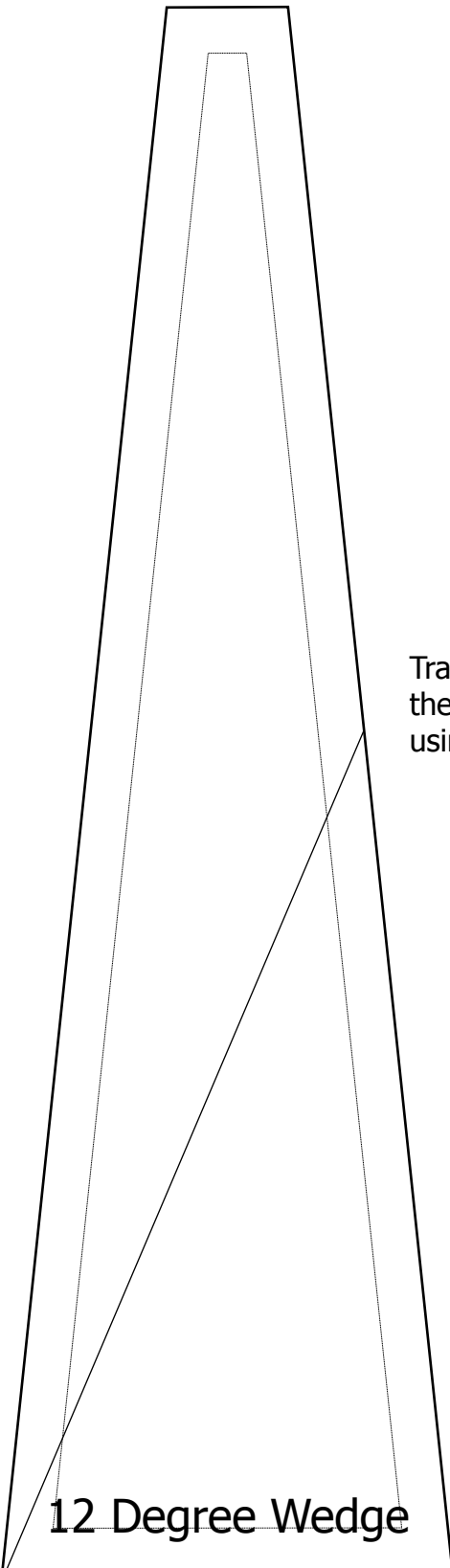
- Remove the tape from the wedge and place it on the other side to reverse the angle of the line.
- Sew three strip sets of B/C fabric.
- Cut five wedges from each B/C strip set, for a total of 15 wedges.



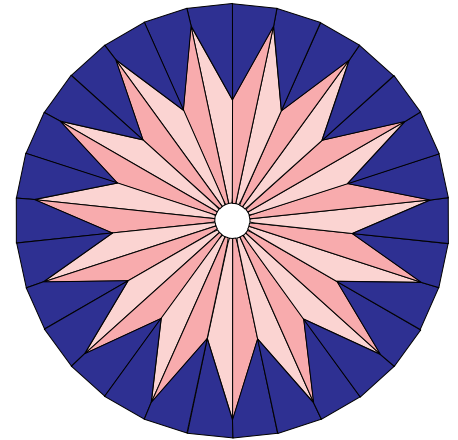
- Pin an A/C wedge to a B/C wedge, matching tips and wide ends. Be careful not to stretch the bias edges.
- Sew two wedges together, matching both the tip and wide ends.
- Sew the 15 wedge pairs.
- Sew the wedge pairs together to form a circle.



Sew 15 wedge pairs



Trace the angled line onto the 12 degree wedge tool using a removable marker.



- Stabilize the center opening by ironing a scrap of freezer paper to the back side.
- Using the circle on the next page, create a freezer paper applique.
- Applique the circle over the center opening.
